The Psalms & Collect are from the Sunday Mass.

The Scripture readings are from the daily Masses in Lent.

The Hymn is from daily Lauds & Vespers in Lent.

ORDER FOR PRAYERS

BEGIN with the Opening Verses and the Psalm.

READ the Scripture readings for each day.

CONTEMPLATE the Scripture readings, asking yourself what God is saying to you in your situation with these words.

SING or **SPEAK** the Hymn.

PRAY the Kyrie, Our Father, and Collect.

CONCLUDE with the Closing Verses, Our Father, and Hail Mary.
